Societies across the world are evolving risk approaches to deal with the increasingly frequent and intense natural hazards. One such approach, Adaptive Social Protection (ASP), aims to reduce the severity of underlying vulnerability and risk variables such as poverty, food insecurity and climate change, as well as their increased interaction with natural hazards, such as floods, hurricanes or earthquakes. ASP thereby links social protection, disaster risk management and climate change adaptation. At the same time, the Covid-19 response from various governments is following a similar approach to ASP, which provides opportunities for cross-sectoral learning.



In this webinar, we aim to

- 1) provide background on the ASP concept and its potential cross-sectoral benefits,
- 2) highlight the ongoing global conceptual and practical work on ASP from international organizations and national governments, and
- 3) based on the findings from Indonesia, showcase the demand for ASP, national efforts towards its implementation and expected contributions towards resilience-building.
