Social protection schemes are often centralized, generally coordinated by the national government. Increasingly, the non-state actors are playing significant roles in strengthening the social protection mechanisms in some countries. This holds special significance in Indonesia where non-governmental, non-profit actors and international initiatives like InsuResilience play crucial roles in the larger schemes of social protection.

Finding out how these programmes are incorporating the likely impacts of climate change (particularly from the climate change adaptation perspective) in their planning and implementation can help us in understanding the role that non-state actors can play in both climate change and social protection endeavors. At the same time, investigating if and how the COVID-19 pandemic has led or may lead to changes in the strategy of three key actors in Indonesia (InsuResilience, ILO, AtmaConnect) can allow us to better understand the impact of sudden onset events.



In the webinar we aim to address the following questions:

- 1) What can NGOs like AtmaConnect contribute to social protection?
- 2) Does climate change increase the importance of social protection especially in developing economies and if yes, why?
- 3) Social protection is also closely linked to insurance mechanisms. What levels of insurance (meso, macro, individual level) can be found in Indonesia? Which ones are the most promising?
- 4) What are success factors for non-governmental organisations such as the United Nations agency ILO, when working in developing countries with regard to social protection programmes?
